

Computer Facility

The college recognizes the immense potential of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) for knowledge dissemination, effective learning, and the development of efficient educational services. Therefore, the college has taken all possible steps to ensure that the latest technological developments are well integrated into the institutional infrastructure. The campus is fully equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity, providing students and faculty members with high-speed internet access. The college has nine newly constructed hi-tech fully airconditioned computer labs, equipped with the latest hardware and software to provide students with thorough practical knowledge and hands-on experience of the latest technology in the IT sector. These labs are well connected through Local Area Networks, ensuring seamless communication between devices. Additionally, the labs provide printing and scanning facilities to cater to the needs of the students. Each department of the college has its own individual computing facility with internet access, enabling students to access educational resources relevant to their courses. Moreover, the Network Resource Centre of the college provides computing and browsing facility to both faculty and students. It offers access to a wide range of e-journals and e-books, which can be accessed easily from the college premises. This facility enables students to stay up-to-date with the latest developments in their respective fields, thus preparing them for the challenges of the modern world. The hi-tech computing facilities provided by the college underscore its vision of imparting quality education to its students. These facilities enable students to develop the necessary skills and knowledge to thrive in the fast-paced world of technology and prepare them for the challenges of the future.

Smart Class Rooms

In keeping with the changing education scenario, the college has established smart classes which are a major step towards meeting the modern infrastructure requirements. The smart classes induce motivation and enthusiasm to learn amongst students owing to their hi-tech quality and interesting mode of dispensing information.

Physical Education And Sports Facilities

The college has well-maintained extensive playgrounds and adequate facilities of Hockey, Cricket, Volleyball, Badminton, Net Ball, Chess, Cycling, Fencing, Basketball and Athletics. The college also appoints coaches for each game and provides ample opportunities to the students to participate in Inter-College, Inter-Varsity, State and National Level Championships. Outstanding sports persons who participate at the Inter-Varsity and at the National Level are provided free boarding and lodging, a diet of Rs. 120/- everyday and all other necessary facilities by the sports wing of the college. The in house college gym provides free gym time to students and teachers under the guidance of a trained gym instructor. Weight lifting center has been upgraded and various free off season sports camps are organized every year.

Placement Cell

The college has an efficiently run placement cell for providing on-the-job training and placement to the students. Dr. Priyaka Khanna (Dept. of Commerce) has very successfully steered this cell into a career chiseler which has succeeded in materializing many placements every year in corporate giants like I-GATE Solutions, Tech Mahindra, ICICI, HCL Technologies, WIPRO, IBM, DELL etc. Interested students can take guidance from this cell so that they can be introduced to the competitive corporate world.

Counselling Cell

The counselling cell, managed by the Dept. of Psychology has been established to benefit the students through psychological counselling.

It aims to maintain and enhance the mental health of the students by providing one to one helping relationship, focusing on their growth and adjustment, problem solving and decision making needs.

It aims at assisting the students in developing various life-skills to deal effectively with academic problems, motivational conflicts, family and relationship issues, abuse, stress management etc.

The goal of this counselling cell is to provide students with information that will help them make more appropriate plans and life decisions and to realize their potential to the fullest. **Teacher In – Charge**: Dr. Aditi Satija, **Venue**: Counselling Cell (near Psychology Lab)

Book Shop

The College Book Shop provides all text books and practical copies to the students at reasonable prices. Books pertaining to the university syllabus and general books are made available to hostellers as well as day scholars.

Bank Service

For the convenience of the students and the staff, the college has an extension counter of Punjab and Sind Bank, Ludhiana which is very useful for hostel students as well. ATM facility is also available.

Provision Store

The College has a provision store which caters to the needs of the students especially the hostellers. Daily requirement material as well as stationery items are available at minimal prices for the students.

College Canteen

The college has a well furnished, huge canteen which offers a variety of eatables at reasonable prices and a clean and hygienic atmosphere to the students. The canteen is spacious and airy with comfortable seating arrangement and proper ventilation to ensure favourable conditions for the students. It provides a haven of sorts to students in their free periods and makes their break time worth while.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The college has a grievance redressal cell to address the grievances of the students. Any problem being faced by a student is taken care of in the cell. A suggestion box has been installed outside the main office. Any student can make use of it for the improvement of the college by giving productive suggestions.

Medical Help

The college has a tie-up with Gurdev Hospital for 24 hour emergency service provision for the students. The students undergo medical check-up every year and a doctor is made available in the college campus in case of an emergency. This practice provides a kind of security not only to students but to their parents as well.

College Magazine (Rashma)

Rashma is an avenue of self expression for the students as well as the staff. It has English, Hindi, Punjabi, Economics, Science and Commerce sections. Published annually, it is edited by staff-editors and student-editors. Dr. Kamini Sahir (Head, Dept. of Hindi) is the incharge of the college magazine & students interested in giving expression to their creativity should contact her. The genius that lies dormant amongst most of us can break through its hesitancy and be put into print through this opportunity.

KCW Spectrum

The college newsletter KCW 'Spectrum' enlisting the activities of the college is published bi-annually. Dr. Honey Walia (Dept. of English) is the editor of the Spectrum and the staff & students can give the required information

to her from time to time regarding their extraordinary achievements. This documentation provides further impetus to staff and students alike to tread untrodden paths & achieve new heights.

Hostel Facility

The college hostels can accommodate approximately 700 students very comfortably. The hostels have common rooms, visitors' room, computer room, T.V. room, Study room & Indoor games facility as well as photostat facility. A lady doctor visits the hostel dispensary on regular basis. The hostels of the college provide an environment akin to home and a homely treatment is meted out to the hostellers in addition to inculcating discipline among them. Airy rooms, clean ambience and healthy food provision make the stay in the hostels a pleasurable one. The MMK hostel has been recently upgraded with the comfort of A.C. rooms & free gym for hostellers is also provided with flexible timing.

College Library

LIBRARY: THE KNOWLEDGE RESOURCE CENTER

The college library is fully air-conditioned, partially-automated, and has a huge reservoir of books on various subjects. Library has very rich collection of 64049 books and 5 e-books on various branches of knowledge. Apart from books, the library also subscribes to 28 subject journals, 28 magazines and 13 newspapers. Library has a fully air-conditioned Reading Room with the capacity of 100 seats. The library web blog is a gateway to the latest information about its resources, rules & regulations and services of the library (https://librarykcwldh.blogspot.com).

The college library is computerized using the Software for University Libraries (SOUL 2.0) software which is state-of-the-art integrated library management software designed and developed by the INFLIBNET Centre of UGC. Library Infrastructure includes 6 terminals for internet surfing for students and faculty members, 4 terminals for working of staff, 2 terminals for OPAC and 2 Printers. Our Web OPAC library system provides a gateway to all the Library Books.

Book Bank

The book bank caters especially to the needs of those students who cannot afford to buy textbooks. Deserving students can get text books issued for the session from the book bank of the library. Photostat facility along with internet facility is available in the college library.

E-RESOURCES

The college is a member of N-List consortia of INFLIBNET, vide which online access to over 6000 e-journals and 1,99,500 e-books, alongwith access to a large collection of JSTOR e-resources is made available to both the faculty and the students.

P.U. Extension Library

On the recommendation of the college Librarian and with the permission of the Principal, students of the college can become the members of extension library by filling the prescribed form.

One of the salient features of the library is the latest collection of books on how to crack competition exams like NET, Bank exams, IAS, PCS, IELTS, CAT etc. The ambience of the library supports a quiet and peaceful place for study.







Rules and Regulations



Change of Subject

A student is permitted to change her faculty / subjects within a stipulated time period. The student will have to fill in a subject-change form duly signed by the concerned teachers and parents. Admission to a course/subject will be given, provided there is availability of seat and in compliance with the subject combination offered by the college as per University rules. No student will be allowed to change the faculty / subjects after the recommended time period which shall be notified to them by their teachers.

Attendance

If a student remains absent for 7 continuous days, without prior information to the college, her name will be struck off the rolls of the college and the student will have to seek re-admission. In order to be eligible to appear in the exams conducted by the University it is compulsory for each student to atleast attend 75 lectures in each subject (Theory & Practical separately).

Identity Card

It is compulsory for each student to get an identity card issued from the tutor. The students must carry their Identity Card with them during the college hours failing which they will be fined.

Leave Rules

- 1. It is compulsory to fill the leave form, if applying for leave.
- 2. The leave form has to be signed by the parent/guardian and it is compulsory to get the leave sanctioned in advance.
- 3. Leave for 5 to 10 days can be sanctioned by the tutor or the senior tutor.
- 4. In case of Medical Leave, a Medical Certificate signed by M.B.B.S./M.D. doctor must be attached with the leave form.
- Submission of leave/medical leave allows exemption from fine only and in no case does it exempt the student from other conditions which

are required to be fulfilled for appearing in the final examinations.

Mobile Phone Not Allowed

The Students are not allowed to use mobile phones in the class rooms/library during teaching days and during examinations.

Car Parking

The students are not allowed to park their cars inside the college campus and they are supposed to park their scooters at the allotted places after procuring tokens for the same.

College Uniform

It is compulsory for the students to wear college uniform (white suits) every Wednesday and for all college functions. The defaulters shall be fined.

Summer: White suit with white dupatta.

Winter: White suit with white dupatta & black

sweater.

The students are allowed to wear trousers on Fridays & Saturdays only.

Mid Semester Tests

- 1. Mid Semester Tests/Examination will be conducted, in accordance with University rules.
- Internal assessment of each student will be sent to the University on the basis of the marks secured in these examinations/ projects/ assignments/regularity in attending classes.
- 3. In case of illness during the examination, medical leave has to be submitted during the examination only. It will only provide exemption from fine and will not give any relaxation in conditions required to be fulfilled to become eligible to appear in the final examinations.
- 4. It is the responsibility of the parents/guardians to inquire about the requirements regarding attendance/examinations.

Working Committees & Clubs

Advisory Committee:

The College has an advisory committee responsible for the discussion and formulation of rules pertaining to academic, cultural, sports and disciplinary matters. It comprises the college Principal and 6 senior staff members and the decisions taken by this committee are final.

Student Council

- a) This council is formed according to the university rules every year to uphold the discipline of the college.
- b) The Principal of the college is its head and the faculty members of the college supervise its activities.
- c) The student council members are elected on the basis of merit and participation in extracurricular activities.
- d) The council works in various capacities under the President, Vice-President of the council and Class Representatives. The student council is, at all times, engaged in the smooth functioning of the college with all its members ensuring complete maintenance of discipline and a favourable atmosphere in the college. Their exemplary and disciplined behaviour is emulated by other students which enhances the decorum of the college Every year, on sports day, the council makes an effort to put forth an idea that is thought provoking either through the medium of a rally or an enactment. The members of the council act as spokespersons of the students of the college and address their problems and communicate their suggestions to the teachers and administration, thereby strengthening the teacher-student relationship and living up to their motto "We share, we care".

Clubs & Committees:

The clubs & committees provide an avenue to students to express themselves freely and to bring out their latent talent. For over-all development of personality, these committee and clubs organize

These cadets attend diverse camps throughout the year like CATC, TSC, AIVSC, PVSC etc. The students interested in taking up NCC can contact Dr. Paramjeet Kaur (Dept. of Commerce.) and can become a part of NCC air wing or NCC Army Wing.

NSS:

In order to enthuse the virtue of selfless social service and to educate the youth towards constructive community service, the college enrolls students in its 3 NSS units every year. This NSS wing operates under the stewardship of Ms. Vibha (Dept. of History), Ms. Mandeep Arora (Dept. of Sanskrit) and Dr. Sonia Mala (Dept. of Hindi). IQAC:

An Internal Quality Assurance Cell is functional in the college catering to quality enhancement at all times. The aim of providing quality education by focusing on learners' requirements is the catalyst behind the dogged determination and hard work of the faculty. The Cell also monitors the parallel growth of the staff members and introduces policies to strengthen the infrastructure of the college. Bachelor of Commerce

The duration of Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) programme shall be of three years (six semesters) There are three units of B.Com in the college. The programme allows widest possible scope in fields like

2. Company Secretary

3. Chartered Financial Analyst

Commerce graduates can also join management programme with finance specialization where they can get expert knowledge and fantastic job offers. They can also choose a career in computer related courses offered by various institutions. Eligibility Criteria for admission to B.Com.I is as follows:

 - Commerce (or Theory of Commerce or Foundation Course in Commerce), Accountancy (or Book Keeping and Accountancy), Economics, Mathematics (or Statistics), Business Organization (or Business Management of Theory and Practice Management), Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance), Banking and Trade, Commercial Geography, Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management), Mercantile Law (or any Company Law) Auditing, Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting).
- b) 10+2 Examination or B.A. Part I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 45% marks in aggregate.
- c) 10+2 Examination or B.A. Part I/B.Sc. Part-I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of the Panjab University under the Old Scheme not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.

Note:

- 1. It is compulsory for the students who have taken admission in B.Com-I to attend the college regularly for first 10 days. The names of students who are absent without leave will be struck off the college rolls.
- The syllabus for the 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th Semesters shall be followed strictly in accordance with P.U. Chandigarh regulations. The Syllabus for 1st and 2nd semesters is subject to change as per the Panjab University Guidelines.
- Two add-on courses [Bank management and Computer Based Accountancy are available for the commerce students and can be opted for during their graduation course to avail the benefit of dual degree.

The course offers knowledge about still life, murals, glass painting, portraits etc. This can become a source of income even while sitting at home.

The growing emphasis on tourism industry and changing life styles of people demands specialists to meet the global challenge in the field. A. Computer Applications (For B.Sc. Non-Medical Only)

NO. OF SEATS: 80

Admission Rules



- Application for admission is to be submitted only on the PRESCRIBED FORM online on the College Website.
- The students must bring their ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS at the time of admission.
- 3. The candidate must be PRESENT PERSONALLY at the time of admission.
- 4. The printout of the admission form must be SIGNED BY THE PARENTS or guardians.
- INCOMPLETE application FORM will not be considered.
- BLOOD GROUP certificate (issued by a competent and recognized laboratory) should be attached with the form.
- 7. PROOF of GAP in studies (if any) must be submitted at the time of admission (issued by a magistrate.)
- The students who take part in EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (debates, creative writing, sports, cultural items etc.) are given preference for admission.
- It is mandatory for a student seeking admission in different streams such as Humanities, Science or M.A. in different subjects to fill up DIFFERENT FORMS. No change from one group to another shall be allowed later on without permission
- 10. For socially, economically and educationally backward girls from rural areas, 70% of the SEATS are RESERVED provided these candidates fulfil the remaining conditions for admission.
- 11. Preference is given to children of DEFENCE PERSONNEL who are in service.
- 12. Those students whose results are LATE can take ADMISSION within 10 days of the declaration of their results.
- Any student who has been DISQUALIFIED by any Board/University will not be granted admission to the college.
- 14. A student with RE-APPEAR in any subject in the previous examination will be given provisional admission to the next class. (Only college students with compartment result will be considered.)

- 15. The PRINCIPAL reserves the RIGHT TO CANCEL the application form of any student without assigning any reason.
- This admission is PROVISIONAL till approved by the Panjab University.
- 17. Subject/stream taken up in the first year CANNOT BE CHANGED in the second or the third year.
- 18. A student of any other university who is placed in COMPARTMENT in 1st year/ 2nd Year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A./B.B.A. course WILL NOT BE ALLOWED to join the 2nd Year / 3rd Year course of this university.

Ragging is Strictly Prohibited in the College

To curb the menace of ragging in the higher educational institutions, the UGC has drafted strict regulations, the violation of which can lead to dire consequences. (In exercise of the power conferred by clause (g) of sub section (l) of section 26 of the UGC Act 1956).

Ragging Means the Following

Any disorderly conduct whether by words-spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehensions thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary case and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

The Punishable Ingredients of Ragging are:

Abetment to ragging, criminal conspiracy to rag, unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging, public nuisance created during ragging, injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt, wrongful restraint and confinement, use of criminal force, assault as well as severe offence or even unnatural offence, extortion, criminal trespass, offences against property, criminal intimidation, attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim (s), all other offences following from the definition of Ragging.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Cancellation of admission
- J Suspension from attending classes.
- J Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- J Withholding result.
- J Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament etc.

Note:

After seeking admission to the college all the students are required to visit the website amanmovement.org and fill the anti ragging undertakings (By Students & their Parents) and follow all the instructions mentioned therein.

Hostel Rules

- 1. A separate form must be filled for the admission to the hostel and this form can be obtained from the college office. Admission to the hostel shall be in accordance with the merit of the students.
- 2. The total annual fees for the hostel shall have to be paid in single installment.
- 3. New admission shall take place every year. It is not necessary that a student getting admission one year in hostel shall get admission the next year also. A student is not allowed to join the hostel without seeking re-admission, having left the hostel once.
- 4. In case a student fails twice in the same class, she will not be allowed to stay in the hostel.
- 5. It is compulsory for the parents to submit two attested photographs of all the visitors in addition to their own photographs at the time of the admission of their ward to the hostel. The hostellers can leave the hostel premises only with those visitors allowed by their parents and with the permission of warden/Principal.
- 6. It is compulsory for the students to affix their photographs on the leave record book. In case of loss of the book, leave shall not be granted on an ordinary paper.
- 7. Leave for home visit shall be granted only once in a month. If the student remains on leave for a long period of time without prior permission, then she will have to pay fine, the amount of which shall be decided on per day basis.
- 8. The brothers, sisters, parents, guardians of the students can visit them only on Saturdays and Sundays. Those who visit on other than the prescribed days and timing shall be sent back without letting them meet their wards.

VISITING HOURS: Summers: 3 PM to 6 PM, 9AM to 5 PM
Winters: 3 PM to 5 PM, 9AM to 5 PM

- 9. The visitors must not be taken to the rooms/canteen and in case of violation, a fine will have to be paid.
- 10. In case of some emergency at home, the student can go home accompanied by the person assigned for the same by the hostel authorities. The travel allowance for the same will have to be paid by the student.
- 11. No visitor shall be allowed to visit the students during college hours and no such members shall be allowed to visit the students whose name has not been mentioned in the name list presented by the student's parents.
- 12. Games are compulsory in the evening except on Saturdays and Sundays. The timing for the games shall be put on the notice board.
- 13. Except on Sunday, the time for studying has been specified from 9:00PM to 10:30PM and proper supervision is undertaken during these hours.
- 14. All the letters shall be given to the hostellers after being opened by the warden.
- 15. If any student leaves the hostel without the permission of the warden, then she will not be allowed to stay in the hostel.
- 16. It is compulsory for all the students to attend all college functions. No leave shall be granted on the days of the functions.
- 17. In case a student is unwell, she must report to the warden.
- 18. Students can keep mobiles with the permission of their parents. The Mobiles given to them by their parents, the mobile model and the number have to be registered with the hostel authorities.
- 19. It is compulsory to be in the mess at the specified time for the meals. The students shall appear for their meals only in proper dress.
- 20. The students are not permitted to be in the hostel rooms during college hours (i.e. from the 1st period to the 6th period).
- 21. The day-scholars will not be allowed to visit their friends in the hostel and neither will they be allowed to stay in the hostel.
- 22. The students are not allowed to keep any precious articles, jewellery or a big amount of money in their possession.
- 23. It is compulsory for the students to attend to their roll-call every evening.
- 24. The students can be asked to vacate the hostel in case of bad behavior or immoral conduct.
- 25. The use of electrical gadgets like heater/iron is prohibited in the hostel.
- 26. Admission shall not be given to any casual or married student.
- 27. The entry / exit must be entered at the gate in the register provided for the same.
- 28. Protective measures shall have to be followed by all in the wake of the Covid pandemic according to the guidelines issued by government.
- 29. Students who have lost their parents shall be accommodated in the hostel only after the presentation of the relevant proof.
- 30. Those students who do not come back to the hostel after semester breaks shall not be allowed to continue their stay in the hostel.

Note: A Hosteller cannot become a Day-Scholar during the session.

Awards & Honours



(Certificate of Appreciation)

Certificate of Appreciation is awarded on the Prize-Distribution Function of the College to the students who excel in the Pre-Semester Examination on the basis of the total marks obtained by them in various subjects and aggregate on the following conditions:

- They should appear in all the papers (Practical & Theory) of various subjects in Pre-Semester Examination.
- They should pass in all the papers and score at least 50% marks in the subjects for which they are being awarded the certificate.

Note: If a student does not fulfil these conditions, then the prize is given to the next student on the merit list.

Roll of Honour, College Colour & Merit Certificate

Students are awarded Roll of Honour, College Colour and Merit Certificate on the basis of their achievement in the field of Academics, Cultural Activities and Sports. Only those students will be eligible whose behavior is found to be satisfactory and attendance is upto mark in all the subjects.

The students eligible for the Roll of honour shall be awarded the same only in the final year of their degree course. The Roll of Honor is Awarded once in one field and is awarded the second time to the same student only in case of achievements in some other field (Co-curricular activities) or in some other degree level.

Academic

Roll of Honour

- Roll of Honour in Academics is awarded to those students who obtain any one of the first three university positions in the final year of their post graduate/graduate (Hons.) course.
- Roll of Honour in academics is also awarded to those students who obtain any one of the first three university positions in the final year of their graduate pass courses

Merit Certificate:

- Merit Certificate in Academics is awarded to those students who obtain any position between 4th to 6th positions in the final years of their post graduate/graduate (Hons.) courses.
- Merit Certificate in Academics is also awarded to those students who obtain any position between 4th to 10th positions in the final year of their graduate pass course.

Sports

In the field of sports, the players of following categories shall be awarded Roll of Honour, College Colour and Merit Certificate.

Roll of Honour

- Members of the team which secures first or second position in Senior National/All India Inter University Championship and in Individual competitions to those students who bag the first, second or third positions.
- 2. Members of the winning team in the Junior National Championship and in Individual competition to those players who bag the first or second position.
- 3. Captain of the State (Senior) or University team.
- 4. Student who creates a new University record.

College Colour

- 1. To the team which emerges winner in the University level championships.
- 2. To a player, who participates in the National or Inter University Team.
- To a player, who secures first position at Individual level in the University or State level competition.

Merit Certificate

- 1. To the team which emerges 1st runner up in the University level championships.
- 2. To a player who secures 2nd position at Individual level in the University or State level competitions.

Social & Cultural Activities

Roll of Honour

Roll of Honour for social and cultural activities is awarded to those students who secure 1st position in the Inter-Zonal/Inter-University/State/National Level competition in individual and group items or to those students who secure at least 25 points in the inter college competitions in the final year of their degree/masters course (5, 3, 2 points respectively for 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions).

College Colour

College colour is awarded to those students who secure 2nd and 3rd positions in individual or group items in the Inter-University/Inter-Zonal/ State/ National Level Competitions in individual and group items or to those students who secure 20-24 points in inter-college competitions in the Final year of their Degree/Masters course. College Colour is also awarded to those students who have published a book in their name.

Merit Certificate

Merit Certificate is awarded to those students who secure 1st and 2nd position in individual or group items in Zonal Youth Festival or to those students who secure 15-19 points in the inter-college competitions in the Final year of their Degree/Masters course. Apart from the above, the students with the following achievements will be given marks accordingly for the Merit Certificate

For Publication/Radio or TV talk shows in the following categories:

- a) In local newspaper/journal/local channel 2 marks.
- b) In state level newspaper/journal/channel 3 marks.
- c) In national level newspaper / journal / national
 Channel-5 marks.

NCC

Roll of Honour

Roll of Honour for NCC is awarded to those students who take part in Republic Day Parade, Youth Exchange Programme or to the student who is declared the best in event related activities at National Level Competitions / Camp Organized by Govt. or Govt. recognized institution. In addition, cadets who secure more than 25 points also become eligible for Roll of Honour.

College Colour

College colour for NCC is awarded to those students who participate in the Thal Sena/Vayu Sainik Camp. In addition, cadets who secure 20-24 points also become eligible for College Colour.






